Mr. Marc DelMonico is a PhD candidate working on his dissertation in historic and systematic theology at the Catholic University of America. His academic background is in the areas of theology of church, ecumenical theology, and liturgical theology. Marc also has an extensive ministry background, having been involved in urban parish work, liturgy, RCIA, pastoral care, and ecumenical work in his hometown of Utica, New York and in the Washington DC area. In 2011, Marc helped to co-found Perisphere Media, a local website design company that works with a number of faith-based nonprofit organizations.

Msgr. Paul McPartlan is a priest of the diocese of Westminster (UK) and Carl J Peter Professor of Systematic Theology and Ecumenism at the Catholic University of America. He is a member of the International Theological Commission and a member of the international commission for theological dialogue between the Catholic Church and the Orthodox Church. He specializes in ecclesiology, Eucharist, ecumenism, and Vatican II and has published several books and many articles in these areas.
