Conventual Franciscan Friar Berard Marthaler is a retired professor of religion and religious education at The Catholic University of America. He earned a doctorate in sacred theology from the Seraphicum in Rome and a doctorate in philosophy from the University of Minnesota. In addition to his classic book, *The Creed: The Apostolic Faith in Contemporary Theology*, he is also the author of numerous articles appearing in such publications as *Ecumenical Trends*, *National Catholic Reporter*, *America*, *Commonweal*, *Horizons*, and *St. Anthony Messenger*. He currently is in residence at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church in the Brookland neighborhood of Washington, DC.
