(Director, Catholic Apostolate Center).

Father Frank Donio, SAC serves as Director of the Catholic Apostolate Center, which develops formation programs for the New Evangelization, First Consultor (Vicar Provincial) and Director of Formation of the Immaculate Conception Province of the Society of the Catholic Apostolate (Pallottines), and Rector of Pallottine Seminary at Green Hill in West Hyattsville, MD. He is also an Adjunct Professor at St. Joseph's College of Maine in the online Theology program and at Fordham University in the Graduate School of Religion and Religious Education. Father Donio is currently collaborating with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on the development of a print publication and online resources called the "New Evangelization Toolkit." He holds a Doctor of Ministry degree in Adult Spiritual Formation from The Catholic University of America.
